



CITY COUNCIL ACTIONS

In an effort to increase community awareness and understanding, this publication was created to detail and explain the recent actions of the Huber Heights City Council through its meetings and legislative actions. This information will also further promote a better understanding of the role played by the City Council in keeping Huber Heights a great community in which to live, work, play, and visit.

City Council took the following actions at the March 22, 2021 City Council Meeting:

- The Mayor presented a proclamation declaring March, 2021 as Women's History Month.
- The Culture and Diversity Citizen Action Commission presented certificates and prizes to the winners of the Black History Month essay contest at Weisenborn Junior High School.
- Approved a resolution to approve a development agreement with Dogtown at Southpointe Crossing.
- Waived the second reading and approved an ordinance to authorize various supplemental appropriations.
- Waived the second reading and approved an emergency ordinance to approve a capital lease for a new medic for the Fire Division.
- Approved three (3) resolutions to awards contracts for the Engineering Division:
 - 2021 Street Program – Award Contracts
 - 2021 Sidewalk Program and Concrete Portion of the 2021 Street Program – Award Contracts
 - Wellfield Study – Award Contracts
- Discussed the 2021 First Tier Suburbs Economic Development Application.
- Approved a resolution to approve an employment agreement with Scott Falkowski as Interim City Manager.
